Day 1 vs Durham

Sunderland Tennis Centre is an 8-court indoor facility, with 6 courts allocated to the 18U county cup event. On the first day we were allocated 2 courts on one side of the viewing balcony and 1 court on the other side, making viewing all of the matches the equivalent of a cardio style workout!

The first 3 players on to court were Tom Round, Sam Cassidy & Owen Perry, playing singles at numbers 6, 5 & 4 respectively. Owen went ahead 2-0 in the first set against the Durham no.6 a hold and a break, but couldn't quite hold onto the lead and went on to lose the first set & the with his opponent riding the momentum from the end of the first set, went on to take the match for Durham in two sets.

Sam Cassidy stepped on to court to play his first ever 18U county cup singles match. He got off to an understandably nervy start, and conceded the first set. After a set under his belt, he was able to shake off the nerves and really found some of his best tennis to win the second set 6-2. The third set proved to be a difficult physical challenge as Sam's energy levels wavered. The Durham player was able to maintain his energy and form to take the match in the third for his team.

Tom played his way into the first set of his match well with some great consistent play. Unfortunately, the Durham player was a strong no.6 and seemed to be able to rally all day, making just one extra ball each point. After losing the first set, Tom set out to impose his game onto his opponent, with some fantastic aggressive play. Ultimately the Durham play was too consistent, but none the less a good performance from Tom and a great match to watch.

The next 3 players on court were Callum Hooper, Joe McKay & Sam Laidler. It was another two firsts for Callum and Joe who had never been to an 18U county cup event, let alone played at no.2 & no.3 in singles. Callum (age 13) played the Durham no.3 who was 4 to 5 years older and stronger. He played a fantastic first set with some very good level competitive points, losing out with one break of serve against him. The second set Callum was determined to create opportunities to break serve, which was difficult in the first set as the Durham player was serving big and hitting good spots.

Callum managed to earn a number of break points and converted to get the break back in the middle of the set. The Durham player managed to take the win for his team in the end 7-5 in the second set after a very tight end to the set. A great first performance from Callum.

Joe was on court next against the Durham no.2. Joe has made big improvements to his game over the last year, deservedly earning his no.2 spot in the team. His work rate on court in the match was second to none and he showed good match IQ against his opponent. The Durham player was



fast and managed to make a lot of balls in play, even with Joe using his weapons. Joe managed to find a good balance of big hitting and using angles to try and manoeuvre his opponent around the court. In the end the Durham players consistency was too much and won the match in two sets.

Sam Laidler was on for H&W in the no.1 singles spot. Sam knew going into the weekend that it was going to be a tough ask at the top spot, with the average ranking of the other players at 1 being 150 places above his own. Sam put in a very athletic and entertaining performance against a strong Durham player who was 49 in the UK in the 18U rankings. In the end he lost in 2 sets, but left everything out on court and did his team proud!

Last on for the day was the doubles. Owen and Tom were on at third pair and played a good match, narrowly missing out by a single break in the first set, before coming back strong to win the second set 6-1. The champ tiebreak final set was closely contest right up until the half way point, but just a few good points from the Durham pair was enough to win it for their team in the end.

Alfie Mills subbed in for the doubles, anther player who was making their debut 18U appearance, to play with Callum Hooper. The boys competed well through the match, but fell short in the end to an experienced Durham second pair.

By the end of the day of the day, team moral was a little low, but that didn't affect the pair of Sam L & Joe who were as motivated as ever to chalk up a win for the day. The boys played some stunning doubles, with Sam L's reaction volleys and Joe's big forehands and serve's being some of the stand out play of the match. The boys flew into the lead and managed to take the first set. They then narrowly lost out by a break of serve in the second & found themselves in 9-9 in a final set championship tie break. The H&W pair managed to hold their nerve for 2 points in a row and got themselves over the line for a much-welcomed match win and first rubber of the day

Day 2 vs Oxfordshire

Day 2 was always going to be an important one for the team after a loss on the first day. We knew that we would need to try and get a result to give us the best chance to stay in the division and avoid relegation.

The team was motivated and ready to perform for the day. After a good set of performances from all of the players on day 1, we decided that the teams' singles line up would remain the same.

Our first 3 players stepped onto the court, each of them having very tight matches. Owen went down a set in his match, but manage to bring it back to take the second. Owens match went on for what seemed like an age, with some fiercely competitive lengthy exchanges. Whilst fighting off cramp in the third set, the H&W player managed to take the win, with both players coming off court looking ready for a rest.

Callum went on again as the H&W no.3 and played what was arguably the match of the day. He narrowly lost the first set in a tiebreak & then maintained his composure to take the next set in yet another tie break, with some fantastic fast and dynamic baseline exchanges. The Oxford player got off to a good start breaking early in the third and final set and then riding the moment all the way to the end. Callum did all he could to get back into the game, but couldn't find the break back to go down 2-6 in the third.

Joe and Sam L were up against two strong Oxford players for the final singles matches of the day. Joe played some great competitive tennis in the first set, but unfortunately picked up an elbow niggle, which made it challenging to hit through the ball on his forehand. He powered through and tried to keep his footwork intensity high to compensate for the elbow which saw him stay on serve for the first half of the second set, until his opponent managed to get the break at 3-3 and go on to take the second set and the match.

Sam L was able to compete at an even higher level than the previous day. He was able to match his opponent's level for many of the exchanges in the match. His opponent in the end was just a little too consistent at that level and managed to close the match out for the Oxford team.

H&W were 4-2 down going into the doubles. Owen and Tom were back at it again at third pair. They had another very competitive 3 set match, only just losing out 13-11 in the championship tiebreak final set. Sam C and Callum were at second pair and put in a great display in their returning games, breaking serve a number of times throughout the two sets. Unfortunately, holding serve was a challenge, with the opponents breaking more than they did. Sam and Callum lost out in 2 sets, but played a great match.

Sam L and Joe were back on at first pair, feeling confident in their doubles ability after getting the win the previous day. They played a good couple of sets, eventually overcoming the Oxfordshire first pair 7-6 6-4, making them undefeated as a pair.

Day 3 vs Gloucestershire

Going into day 3, the team were aware that it was going to be a tough ask to stave off relegation from the division. H&W would need an 8-1 or 7-2 win against Gloucestershire to stay up.

Alfie Mills came in to play singles at no.6 spot, making his singles debut at 18U county cup. After a nervy start to the first set, Alfie managed to find his form towards the end of the set and managed to put himself a break up in the second set. On a more general note, there is a plan to have 3-4 walking tennis tournaments diarised in the next few weeks for 2024, hopefully culminating in a county championships to tie in with County Week during August.

Overall Summary

The growth of the Open Court programme in H&W during 2023 has been down to a fantastic effort by many clubs and dedicated individuals, who time and again have gone above and beyond to help those less fortunate than themselves get involved and play our sport.

In addition, behind the scenes support by both the County & National LTA has allowed sessions to be delivered to some who would have struggled, if not completely missed out on the opportunity to get involved in tennis. H&W is now firmly on the national map when it comes to Opening up our sport to as many different people as possible.

From my perspective, a huge thank you to clubs, coaches and especially those volunteers who through their amazing efforts have put a smile on someone's face who in many cases has never held a racket before!

COUNTY SAFEGUARDING & WELFARE REPORT

Welcome everyone.

Once again there has been an increase in contacts from both regional LTA and from club safe guarding officers. Thankfully no serious incidents but awareness of guidance around safeguarding is getting through.

The issue of photo and video policies is a common reason for queries and problems; it needs to be clear and implemented properly- so when organising events or tournaments it should feature on the consent forms. The county has recently updated their policies including this one and ask for advice if you are uncertain.

Adrian Todd and I did a presentation in May for the club SOs. It covered various topics but importantly also informed club SOs of the new safeguarding templates that the LTA had been putting together. Clubs should be implementing these when updating websites or when having safeguarding support visits. In an ideal world websites should be reviewed regularly and I am hoping most clubs will have updated their policies by the New Year. I have updated the county policies which are now on the website. The LTA are keen that low level concerns are reported in case there is a pattern and we have been following this guidance.

The county had its own safeguarding support visit in September 23. We were one of the last counties to be done and in fact there was a pressure of time as Regional SO Alyson O' Donnell was leaving. The preparation was a huge volume of work for myself and Adrian. We have not yet had the feedback as this includes a survey of clubs/volunteers/parents being sent out which is being included in the feedback, and at the time of writing this report the results were not available. I am aware of some necessary tweaking of our procedures and have already been made a start on this task. The code of conduct being one good example.

Growing the grassroots:

School Grants - introducing tennis to more children

The LTA Schools initiative carried through into this year and is available for primary and secondary schools to use. Schools are offered the chance of a £250 voucher for equipment or coaching if they complete a simple, free CPD online course. This has been a fantastic opportunity for clubs and coaches to build their relationship with their local schools. Since the initiative started 94 schools have taken up this opportunity in the county.

The initiative comes to an end at the end of this academic year, so we have the chance to do one final push in the schools that have yet to make the most of this offer. We will be circulating a list of those schools who have completed the voucher so that coaches can contact those that haven't done it, early in the new year.

We believe that the work coaches do with their local schools is critical in opening up tennis to more children in the community and driving participation. On the back of this work and Schools Games initiative, more children have the chance to try tennis and potentially link with their local club and coach.

Prime Video – Investment into driving the participation of girls in tennis

Prime Video LTA Youth Girls is a junior tennis coaching programme designed to inspire thousands of girls to pick up a racket and try tennis for the first time. It builds on the work done as part of She Rallies.

Funded by the reinvestment of Prime Video's US Open broadcast fees from Emma Raducanu's historic 2021 final - the programme focuses on creating an environment that motivates girls to enjoy and stay in tennis by giving them the chance to play with friends in a pressure free setting. Earlier this year the LTA delivered bespoke training to coaches to support their understanding of the social and environmental pressures on girls and how to introduce coaching that meets their psychological needs.

A number of coaches in H&W were involved in this initiative and successfully delivered 12 weeks of coaching to groups of girls of all ages. At Boughton Park Tennis Club, the take up from teenage girls was a big surprise and something we can build on in the county for the future.

The initiative continues into 2024 and hopefully more coaches will take up this opportunity.

Coach Education

LTA Youth Schools – Leadership Days

We hope to set up Youth Leader days for the county early next year, building on the idea and success of this LTA initiative last year where groups of teenagers from local schools attended the Young Leaders training course at Pershore. For the next sessions we'd encourage teenage players



from clubs to get involved which potentially encourages them to take their involvement in coaching further.

Coach Qualifications

This year there have been the following courses:

2 Assistant Courses - 20 candidates (24 last year)

1 Instructor Course - 12 candidates

No CPDs done this year vs 2 last year due to lack of interest.

Coach and club network

The LTA Coach Forum took place on 6 November 2023 with coaches taking part from H&W. This forum was delivered by the LTA with on court training and off court work with coaches. This was a great opportunity to network with each other and share ideas. The WhatsApp group continues to be used to offer coaches from across the county the chance to ask questions and request advice.
